GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Tractor has been factory tested and inspected for customer satisfaction. The following installation, operation, and maintenance instructions are recommended for continued satisfactory service.

Figure 1 deleted.

A. BEFORE INSTALLING

- Check for any damage during shipment.
 Place claim with carrier if any is discovered. DO NOT install a damaged tractor
- 2. Check lubricant in gear housing.

 Remove bushing with vent plug from top of gear housing (Items 28 & 19, Page 6). Insert a dip stick in hole until it touches bottom of housing. Withdraw dip stick. There should be oil on the stick to a depth of 2 inches. Replenish if necessary. See LUBRICATION, Page 2.

NOTE

After making sure that oil is at proper level, replace bushing with vent plug in housing.

- Rearrange washers to suit beam flange width. Refer to Fig. 2 and chart, Fig. 3. (Tow clevis is equal to 16 washers.) NOT APPLICABLE for Monorall Suspension
- 4. Be sure track is level and runway surfaces are clean.
- 5. Check power supply.
 It must be the same as that shown on serial plate.
- B. Install tractor on beam.Adjust spring tension.




FIGURE 4 - STANDARD TROLLEY SUSPENSION

Refer to Fig. 4, and chart, Fig. 5. (Page 2)

- Turn nut A until rubber tire touches beam, as shown at point C.
- 2. Measure spring length X.
- 3. Turn nut A to compress spring.
- 4. Measure spring length Y. Continue tightening nut A until Y equals X minus compression shown in chart.
- 5. Lock nut A with nut B.
- C. BEFORE OPERATING
 - Move tractor slowly over beam to make sure there
 is no interference. Allow 1/8" max. clearance between rollers and beam (each side).

(Standard Trolley Suspension only)



- Check beam joints. Too much space between beams, or a difference in height will be noted as wheel passes over. Either condition can chip or break the hard tread surfaces of the wheels.
- Make sure all electrical connections are made in accordance with wiring diagram (inside control box).



If the direction of travel of the tractor does not agree with the push button markings for the particular application, direction of travel may be reversed by interchanging any two line leads at the tractor controller.

Never Change Wiring Leads of the Push Button Station



The fully enclosed aluminum gear housing provides a liberal oil reservoir from which all gears and gear shaft bearings are splash-lubricated. Check oil level in gear housing approximately every 6 months as instructed on page 1 (INSTALLATION—Paragraph 1).

TO ADD OIL—Use A.G.M.A. No. 4, or its equivalent, SAE 40 Machine Oil or SAE 90 Gear Oil. Add through vent hole in gear housing.

TO REPLACE OIL—Oil should be replaced only when tractor is undergoing a general overhaul. Refer to GEAR MODULE REPAIR (Section 1, Page 8), steps 5 and 6.

Bearings outside gear housing (including bearings in monorail trolley wheels, but not standard trolley wheels) are lifetime prelubricated and sealed. They need no additional lubrication.

Bearings in standard trolley wheels are lubricated by means of the lubrication fittings supplied in each axle. Use Bearing Grease No. 1 or any lubricant having the highest grade sodium soap base; ASTM penetration 265-295; and operating range of 0° to 225° F.



MOTOR BRAKE



The motor brake requires an occasional check (approximately every six (6) months) on the gap between the magnet unit (A) and the pressure unit (B). (See figure 6). When installed in the hoist, this gap is set at .020". Tighten nuts on the ends of the studs only if gap has increased to .045". Never tighten to less than .020".

Check thickness of brake lining (Item 5, Page 5). Replace if less than 3/32 inch.

CONTROLLER

Be sure contact points close properly. This insures a proper current path and eliminates the dangers of contactors arcing and chattering. If contact points do not close properly, see

WIRING


Check for loose connections, and to ascertain that insulation has not deteriorated. If wiring must be replaced, follow wiring diagram on inside of motor cover.

A three phase motor with a 220/440V name plate can be reconnected in the field for either 220 or 440 volt power supply. Follow wiring diagram in cover of unit and make indicated changes in connections at motor, brake, and control circuit transformer secondary.

A single phase motor with a 115/230V name plate can be reconnected in the field for either 115 or 230 volt power supply, provided the following conditions are met:

- 24V Control Circuit—115V to 230V or 230V to 115V power supply.
 Follow wiring diagram in cover of unit and make indicated changes in connections at motor, brake, and control circuit transformer secondary.
- 115V Control Circuit—115V to 230V power supply.
 Follow wiring diagram in cover of unit and make indicated changes in connections at motor and brake. Add control circuit transformer.
- 3. 115V Control Circuit—230V to 115V power supply.

 Follow wiring diagram in cover of unit and make indicated changes in connections at motor and brake. Remove control circuit transformer.





The Wright Tractor is composed of three modules, as illustrated in Figure 7. Many repairs can be made by just removing the end cover. The motor can be removed to gain access to the suspension module without removing tractor from beam. However, to drain oil from gear housing (for replacement; or to inspect gears, bearings and seals) or to replace trolley wheels or rollers, tractor must be removed to a service area.

PREPARATION FOR REPAIR

Before starting to do any on-the-spot repairs; or removing tractor to service area; or dismantling for a general overhaul, disconnect tractor from electric power supply.

REPAIRS

MOTOR MODULE

- It is not necessary to disassemble Motor Module unless: 1. Operation indicates that motor bearings are worn or faulty and need to be replaced.
- 2. Operation indicates motor problems, such as burning out or shorting out.
- 3. Inspection of drive wheel indicates a need for replacement, in which case the Motor Module must be removed to gain access.

TO REMOVE MOTOR MODULE

- Refer to Page 8 or Dwg. 64058. Release tension on spring by loosening nucs.
- Provide support for wheel before eliminating support afforded by adapter.
- Remove control box cover.
- Disconnect motor brake wires, using wiring diagram inside cover as a guide.
- 5. Remove attaching screws at Suspension Assembly.
- 6. Detach motor, with motor adapter and control box.
- 7. Check motor bearing and bearings in motor adapter.
- 8. Replace any parts not fit for further service, including the motor, if necessary.

SUSPENSION ASSEMBLY

Use Page 8 (Standard Trolley Suspension) or Dwg. 64058 (Monorail Trolley Suspension) as a visual aid to disassemble and assemble the Suspension Module. Numbers in parentheses throughout these instructions refer to item numbers from the parts lists of these assemblies. Suffix M indicates Monorail Trolley Suspension (Dwg. 64058). Suffix S indicaces Standard Trolley Suspension (Parts Page 8).

TO REPLACE SPRING (Both types of suspension).

Tractor may remain on beam.

- 1. Remove nuts (21S; 12M), washer(17S;11M), and damaged spring(7).
- Replace with new spring.
- 3. Return washer and nuts to original positions.
- 4. Reset tension per instructions on Page 1.
- TO REPLACE ROLLERS OR TROLLEY WHEELS (Std. Trolley)

Tractor may remain on beam. Refer to Page 8

- 1. Provide temporary support for tractor.
- Release tension on spring (7) by loosening nuts (21).
- 3. Remove nuts(23) and washers(20) on outside of one sideplace.
- Remove sideplace. Leave remaining washers undisturbed.
- 5. Replace rollers and/or wheels as required.
- 6. Return sideplate to original position, with washers distributed exactly as before disassembly.
- Repeat for other sideplate if necessary.
- 3. Reset tension in spring per instructions on Page 1.

TO REPLACE DRIVE WHEEL (Standard Trolley)

Release tension on spring. Move tractor to work area.

- 1. Remove motor and motor adapter per instructions under Motor Module Maintenance, steps 3 thru 6.
- 2. Slide wheel off drive shaft (Item 6-Page 7).
- 3. Replace with new wheel.

NOTE

Be sure couplings and shaft (Items 1 and 5, Page 8, and Item 7, Page 7) are in place when reassembling.

- 4. Reassemble motor and adapter to Suspension Module.
- 5. Connect wires per wiring diagram.6. Replace control cover.

TO REPLACE DRIVE WHEEL (Monorail Trolley)

Release tension on spring. Move tractor to work area.

- 1. Remove motor and motor adapter per instructions under Motor Module Maintenance, steps 3 thru 6.
- 2. Detach Gear Module from Suspension Module.
- 3. Allow trolley to remain attached to Suspension Module, eliminating the need for determining the proper distribution of washers when reassembling.
- 4. Remove wheel.

NOTE

Refer to Dwg. 64058. Be sure couplings and shaft (Items 25, 26, and 27) are in place when reassembling.

- 5. While disassembled, check Gear Module as instructed under GEAR MODULE below.
- 6. Reassemble Suspension Module (with new wheel) with Gear and Motor Modules.
- Connect wires per wiring diagram.
- 8. Replace control cover.

GEAR MODULE

Release tension on spring. Move tractor to work area. As a "isual aid to disassemble and assemble, refer to the following illustrated parts lists: MOTOR BRAKE - Page 5

GEAR HOUSING AND GEAFING - Pages 6 and T. Numbers in parentheses in the instructions are item numbers from these pages.

1. Refer to page 8 Remove brake cover (7) by first removing two screws (25).

NOTE

On Nema 3, 4, and 5 Hoists, take care not to damage gasket (10)


- 2. Refer to Page 5
 - a. Check gap between magnet unit (10) and pressure unit (6). For instructions see Page 3.
 - b. Check thickness of brake lining. Replace if less than 3/32 inch thick.
- 3. Refer to Pages 6 and 7.
 - a. Remove drain plug(29) from gear housing(9)
 - b. Drain oil from housing
 - Replace plug.
 - c. Replace plug.d. Remove attaching screws (25 and 26) and lift gear cover (8) from gear housing, taking care not to damage gasket (1).
 - e. Remove gears and pinions. Check teeth for wear.
 - f. All bearings (15 and 18) in gear module are visible for inspection. Replace as required.
 - g. Check oil seals (21, 22, and 24) for signs of wear or deterioration. Replace if necessary.

NOTE

Replace all oil seals during a general overhaul of tractor.

- h. If gaskets (1 and 10) have been damaged, replace them when reassembling.
- i. Reassemble gearing.j. Support hoist in a vertical position (motor end down, gear end up). Pour two pints of oil into open end of gear housing. For type of oil see LUBRICATION, Page 2.
- k. Replace gasker (1), gear cover(8), gasker(10) if any, and brake cover(7).







- (b) Gasket, Item 10, is used only for Nema 3, 4, and 5 applications.




TYPICAL WIRING DIAGRAM SINGLE PHASE, 115/230 V


TYPICAL WIRING DIAGRAM THREE PHASE, SINGLE SPEED


TYPICAL WIRING DIAGRAM THREE PHASE, TWO SPEED






